2013 IN State Meet

Pocket City Suburb Hosts State Meet – Dawson Family Camps Out

Mt. Vernon, IN, Timberlake Ski Club – “When you get to Evansville, keep driving west until you see the signs pointing north to Timberlake, Southern Indiana’s premier water ski lake - home to a bunch of friendly people and some tasty peaches”. So it was with that advice in mind that early Friday morning, the 26th of July, Brian Dawson packed his two boys, Blake and Vince, skis, bikes, pots, pans, and sleeping bags into his truck and headed south, bent on introducing the lads to the joy of tent camping and tournament water skiing.

Once at the lake the three attended to job one – get some ski practice. With practice concluded, Brian and an old bike pedaler went on a sunset training ride - a short ride, they agreed - leaving the lads to pitch the tent and set up camp. Neither rider knowing his way around Posey County much and with light fading, the bikers discovered they were not making the progress back to Camp Timberlake for which they’d hoped. Cell phone flashlights illuminating road signs, the two arrived safely back to an orderly and (surprise!) fully assembled campsite. Dawson announced to his campers that there would be an ice cream run after dinner, to which the boys responded favorably.

Aside from the discomfiting sight of flashing skies through tent fabric and sound of rumbling booms marching closer and closer early Saturday morning, the guys had a great first night. Then the rain came, staying around until mid morning, when the thunder’s rumble was finally replaced with the rumble of ski boats starting and warming up. Cars pulled up, skiers piled out, and within minutes the 64th Edition of the Rollie Williams Memorial Indiana State Water Ski Championships was underway.

Blake Dawson scored 1.5 buoys at long line 28 MPH, total 43.5 buoys, to walk with Boys 1 Slalom gold. Cam Wischmeyer outpointed both Peyton Crowthers and Vince Dawson to take Boys 2 Slalom, running a sweet 2 at 28’ off set. Peyton took to the Trick competition, scoring 380 points and a first place award. No Boys 3 Slalom skiers showed, so the Men 1 took to the course, Briant Detty getting 1.25 buoys at 38’ off to win. Andrew Schmitt, 2nd with 2.5 at 32’ off, and John Farrar, 3rd, trailed Detty. Guest skier Mike Bullock, from Tennessee, also

competed in Slalom, finishing an un-scored 4th place. For Men 1 Trick Jared Sharkey rolled out of the family van and wowed the crowd with a 6690 point extravaganza! Detty was 2nd (2290) and Clay Schmitt, skipping Slalom, was 3rd (1650). Cousin Andrew Schmitt was close behind (1600) in 4th. On Sunday Detty put out the long jump of the meet, 152 feet, to win Men 1 jump, and Overall. Andrew Schmitt, no Jump slouch, cranked a 136 footer, and Clay Schmitt a 115 best. Bullock kept all the Men 1 Jumpers in 3 digit territory with a century pop.

Girls 3 found Caroline Sogard at the starting dock, looking for some competition. Of course, the battle is with those turn buoys and the boat out on the water. Caroline rounded 5 buoys at 30 MPH, scoring 65 total

buoys and earning her first place trophy. In Men 2 James Tranchetta missed running the table when another Mishawaka Shark(ey) – Cody – skied to a 1940 point Trick gold medal, beating Tranchetta by 550 points. James nipped Neal Clark in Slalom, 3.25 at 35' off to Neal's 1.5 at the same length. Sharkey was 3rd in Slalom (Jump, Cody, Jump!). In Jump James proved worthy of first place, and Overall first, with his 139 foot best effort.

Brian Dawson led a quartet of single (event) minded Men 3 Slalom skiers, scoring 4 at 38' off. Jeff Cross was also in 38' off-land, getting 1 buoy, followed by Steve Schenk (3 at 28' off) and Tom Sims who suffered a universal experience – sooner or later, and better to get it out of the way sooner – with a bobble at #1 in his opener.

Molly Harrison had some issues with her first Women 2 Trick pass, but settled in for a 1640 point second pass, total 2490, to earn her trophy. Jenny Lambert took Women 4 Slalom and Prissy Edwards Women 6 Slalom (5.5 at 22' off). DeeDee Tucker got 2 at 28' off in Women 5 Slalom, followed by Jean and Cheryl Schmitt, in that order. Tucker continued her run through the division, winning Trick, Jump (48') and Overall, with Cheryl Schmitt completing the Overall chase, too. Edwards Tricked 1980 points and Jumped 49 feet to sweep all awards in Women 6.

Megan Lambert completed her first year at Purdue with near perfect grades, adding Trick and Jump to her great Slalom skill set for extra credit. So in Women 1 it was all Megan – 4 at 28' off Slalom, 200 point Trick, on only one scoring pass, and 39 foot Jump. Michelle Bullock trailed Megan in each discipline, gamely. Women 2 Slalom was taken by Shannon Buchanan, scoring 2.5 at 32 MPH.

Paul Manning flubbed his second Trick pass in Men 6, still easily outpointing (1270 points on his first pass, alone) John Kniesly, who skidded to a 590 point runner-up spot. Not realizing that a 590 point Trick run would be the performance highlight of this Saturday, Kniesly mounted his bike to join Brian Dawson on a ride to the Ohio River. Many seemingly clear paths to the Ohio are dead ends, so it took awhile to reach the river. Puncturing on a gravel road right before dismounting to admire the roiling Ohio, Kniesly quickly replaced the first damaged tube with a spare. Thirty minutes later, while drafting the speedier Dawson on the highway home, Kniesly rode over a chunk of broken pavement and flattened again. Opening his repair kit Kniesly discovered that his tire patch glue had dried up, a Cardinal sin, so was left at the side of the road while Dawson rode back to get his truck.

Unloading the hapless Kniesly and his bike upon returning to camp, Dawson took to the task of getting himself, Vince, and Blake cleaned up and dressed for the Satur-

day evening Awards Banquet. Every State Tournament Awards banquet is special. It may be the only time during the year that Hoosier skiers see one another wearing something other than a swimming suit and a T shirt.

Sunday morn opened clear and calm – perfect to finish out the Slalom competition and roll into Jumping. However, if you were at Timberlake, or have a schedule of events saved from 2013, don't expect this retelling to adhere to any chronological order.

Tony Lambert and Brian Detty finished 1-2 in Men 4 Slalom, Tony with 3 at 35' off, and Detty with 2 at 32' off. Tied with Men 7 Slalom and Trick for the largest divisions of the meet, atop the Men 5 Slalom podium stood Kim Contos with 3.5 at 38' off. Mark Schmitt was 2nd with 1.5 at 32' off, while Steve Plummer, Barry Felton, and Tom Steinbeck all ran into 28' off. Felton's winning Trick set Saturday (Plummer 2nd and Schmitt 3rd) had carried a nice Overall lead into Sunday, but Schmitt's Slalom run drew them nearly even. Only Felton and Schmitt squared off in jump. Felton, jumping again after a nasty fracture to his femur a few years ago that this writer predicted would be his last time over the ramp, unless he wanted to room with the dog, was first off the dock and put out a 65 foot best jump. Home Boy Schmitt knew he had to go longer to get Overall... and he did, going 74 feet for the Jump and Overall trophies.

Gene Lamberson, in his umpteenth consecutive IN State Tournament, added to his closet full of Trick trophies, this one for Men 8, circa 2013. Put that one on the top shelf, Geno!

The power trio of Little, Sharkey, and Smith played on the liquid stage and finished in that order in Men 7 Trick,

Howard scoring 2080, Randy 1180, and Larry 640 (what!?). Men 7 Slalom was dominated by Gary Hall who ran 5 at 32' off and looked to be on his way to a shot at 35' off before being distracted by a hottie jogging into his sight line for #6 at the east end of the course. Dave Jarrett left his camera on shore to take Slalom 2nd (3.5 at 28' off) also taking 5th in Trick. Sharkey and Smith were 3rd and 4th in Slalom, followed by Don Bucher who uncharacteristically (which is not to say that it has never happened before) blew his opener. Don trailed the Power Trio in Trick, and while it might look like Don should have stayed in Cindonway, he saved face by being the oldest guy at the meet to step into jump skis and face that ol'Demon Red Ramp, counting to 38 before landing and taking Overall.

In Men 5, whoops, Men 6 Slalom John Kniesly found a diamond in what had been a coal bin of a performance year, getting 1 buoy at 38' off. He then jumped 73 feet without getting into any difficulty other than putting on and taking off the world's most used jump suit without shredding it in the process.

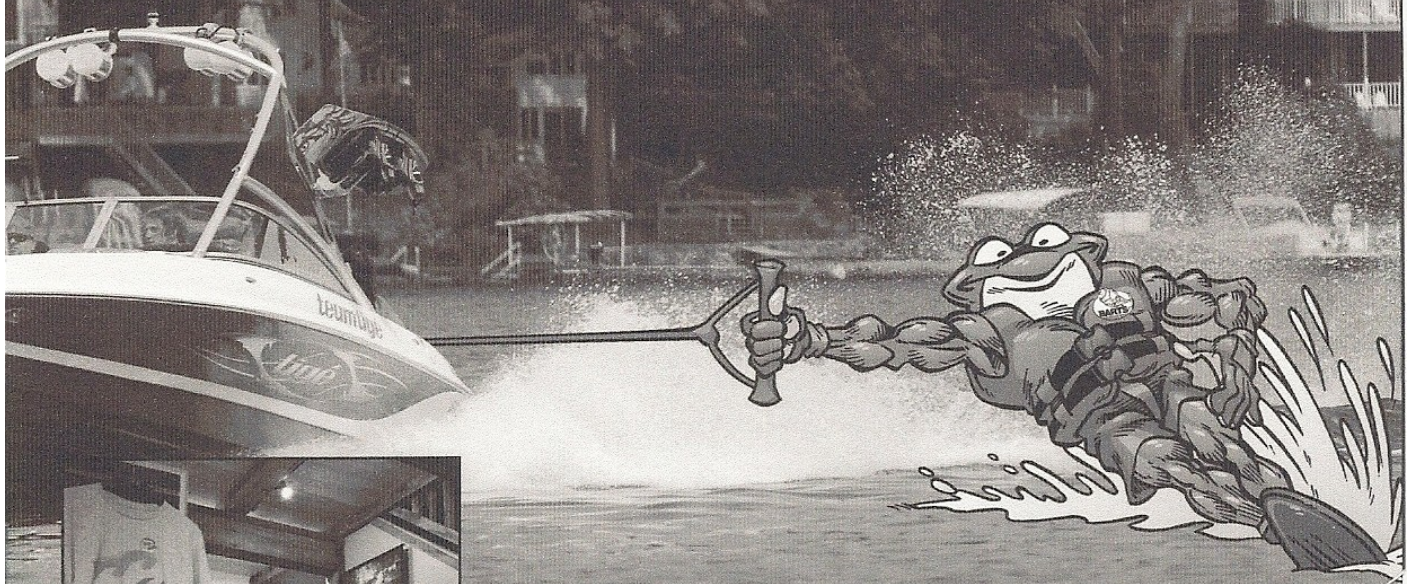
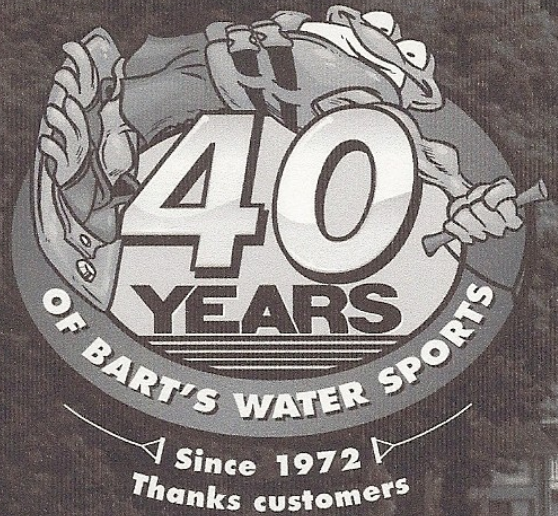

Midwest Regional Report

Minnie Hosts Midwest Regional Ski Competition

Trophy Lake Estates III, Center City, MN – Twenty-four Indiana qualifiers went to Minnesota, land of 10,000 lakes and a lot of pike, for the 2013 USA Water Ski Midwest Regional Championships. All were intent on skiing their best, maybe establishing new PR's, with several having their sights set on podium finishes.

“Center City”. How bland. Had the Commissioners hired an English major to name new towns in the county - someone whose idea of a good book was something other than a manual for installing dishwashers – they would have researched the area's history, interviewed long time homesteaders, and come up with something more appropriate, and colorful. “Beaver Acres”, for example. Water, land, fur trapping – images so Minnesota! The tournament site, *Trophy Lake Estates the Third*, is a pretentious name for a man made ski lake. I wonder why *Trophy Lake Estates Sr.* and *Trophy Lake Estates Jr.*, III's grandsire and sire, didn't get the call? Oh well.

Hoosier skiers set three new MW Regional Championships Records. Prissy Edwards set two of them, scoring 2700 points in Women 6 Tricks and Jumping 68 feet. Open Men Slalom Wunderkind Nate Smith did not disappoint spectators, clearing his 41' off pass before netting 1 buoy at 43' off the line. Edwards also won W-6 Slalom, sweeping Overall as a byproduct.

Scott Tynan was under the gun to clear his 38' off pass in Masters Men Slalom as his lone competitor in the division nearly ran that pass himself, scoring 5.5 buoys. Dang! No problem for Scott. Once nailing the 38' off pass and assuring a ½ buoy win, Scott consoled his comrade by stretching the margin to 3 buoys, scoring 2.5 buoys at 39.5' off.

Veteran Don Bucher nabbed a Men 7 Overall trophy by scoring 2nd in Slalom and Jump, and 4th in Trick. Molly Harrison, in Women 2, continued her string of MW Regional Trick titles, scoring 3090 points for the win. New Carlisle's Jill Smith, another Trick specialist, won Women 3 with 4120 points.

Jared Sharkey was in another galaxy as far as other Men 1 trick skiers were concerned, scoring 6170 points to win by over 3200 points! At the other end of the age spectrum (physically, not mentally!) Men 6 Trick specialist Paul Manning, the pride of Bringham, won his event with 1900 points.

Sam Jackson squeaked out a Men 1 Slalom title, getting

around #2 at 38' off and making it back to the wakes, edging his opponent by ½ buoy. Speaking of extra effort Slalom sets, Sabrina Klinkhammer, she of the Rochester, Lake Manitou Klinkhammers, got a 5th in Women 2 Slalom. Sabrina was “all in” for the pull to #4 at 22' off, getting just enough in the mayhem that ensued for ¼ buoy and a place on the podium. Husband Jeff was no slacker himself, going 2 at 32' off in Men 4 Slalom, though in that tough company only good for 18th.

Cam Wischmeyer tied for 1st in Boys 2 Slalom, with 2 at 28' off, losing out in the run-off to a skier two years his senior, which at age 11 is HUGE! Kim Contos managed 3.5 buoys at 38' off in Men 5 Slalom, good for 2nd and bragging rights over a familiar Ohio skier nipping at his heels. Megan Lambert led her family scoring, just missing out on Women 1 Slalom hardware when the 5th place run-off went to another skier. Still, her 3.5 buoy at 28' off propelled her to an 8th place Overall finish. Dad, Tony, skied to 8th in Men 4 Slalom with 4.25 at 35' off. Finishing the Silent Shores scoring was Neal Clark, 4th in Men 2 Slalom (5 buoys at 32' off).

In Men 7 Tricks, Twin Lakes' own Howard Little encountered two other specialists and finished 3rd. Cheryl Schmitt, finally enjoying a different division than Ms. Edwards, was 4th in Women 5 Slalom, 2nd in Trick and Jump, also 2nd in Overall. In a tight Men 2 Trick field only 550 points separated 3rd place Cody Sharkey from #1. Jeff Cross, 4.5 buoys at 35' off, was 8th in Men 3 Slalom.

Clay Schmitt, Overall Men 1 contender, left his Slalom and Trick mojo in Mt. Vernon. Thanks to a strong 112' Jump (6th) he got 5th Overall, but was left imagining what could have been had he packaged all three events in a more balanced showing. Peyton Crowthers was 12th in Boys 2 Tricks and 19th in Slalom, and Tom Jackson, Sam's driver, tied for 16th in Men 4 Slalom with 2.5 at 32' off.

Caroline Sogard, age 14, opened her Girls 3 Slalom set at 32 MPH under conditions that caused others to dial back opening speeds to as low as 28MPH. Had Caroline gazed into the crystal ball and seen a 4.5 buoy opener she may have dropped her starting speed, but take heart, Caroline, many skiers share that experience with you.

Indiana skiers compiled a score that landed the federation in 5th out of the ten states that make up the Midwest Region. Next year skiers return to Waters Edge, in Wilmington, IL for Midwest Regional competition.

Okeehlee Beckons Skiers to US Nationals

Jared Sharkey, Nate Smith Excel

West Palm Beach, FL, Okeehlee Park - Top skiers in the state competed in the 71st Goode Water Ski National Championships at West Palm Beach's Okeehlee Park, famous for its five pristine water ski lakes. Eighteen athletes from the state competed, with nine of those gaining a top five podium finish.

Specialist Jared Sharkey, Mishawaka, dominated his Men 1 Trick event. Jared scored 6000 points, two-thirds of which were credited in his second trick pass which included a dizzying array of single ski wake flips. Indiana's top pro, Nate Smith, McCordsville, climbed atop the Open Men Slalom podium, bettering Chris Parrish and Nick Parsons each by $\frac{3}{4}$ buoys, scoring 2.25 buoys at 41' off the standard length ski rope. Smith had been regularly beating the pro field in multi-round slalom events leading up to the Nationals. The pressure is much greater under the US Nationals' "one and done" single round format, but Smith came through for the win.

Slalom skiers who clear the 38' off pass are widely accepted as having crossed the threshold into stardom. Eighteen year old Sam Jackson, Columbus, was one of only two Men 1 skiers who did just that. At the next shorter line length, 39.5 feet off, Jackson got around buoy number 2, scoring 1.5 buoys, while his fellow competitor in super-short line slalom got a piece of #3 with a score of 2.25 buoys for the win. While finishing as runner-up at that line length is an outcome any would envy, Jackson has sights on a slightly higher podium step, and an even shorter ski rope!

Another Columbus skier, Cam Wischmeyer, finished 18th in Boys 2 Slalom, but was the second highest 11 year old in this division, and at 5 buoys at 22' off, was only 8.5 buoys behind 9th place, with a tight grouping from there all the way to the top. Neal Clark, Frankfort, was 9th in Men 2 Slalom – the last stop before top speed reduces to 34MPH. Neal scored 3 at 35' off, continuing to move into shorter line lengths and bigger buoy count. Cody Sharkey, also a Mishawaka skier, was 6th in Men 1 Trick, even though an error in his second pass resulted in a goose egg type score. With a stand up pass an award ceremony with two Sharkey's present looked like a good bet.

With 2390 points Molly Harrison, Indianapolis, finished 6th in Women 2 Tricks, a scant 20 points out of 5th and a place in the medal ceremony. Anguish! New Carlisle's Jill Smith continued her winning streak at the Nats, easily outpointing the field in Women 3 Tricks with 4470 points.

Women 1 Overall competition included Megan Lambert, Brownsburg, for the first time, reflecting the influ-

ence going to college can have on a young woman formerly intent on skiing around buoys. Jitters on the Slalom course were uncharacteristically evident, and with Trick and Jump just recently added to her training regimen, Megan has great potential to make some Overall noise next year. Congratulations, Megan, on your 13th place Overall finish! Tony Lambert, Megan's dad, went into the nationals after a sub-par (for him) Men 4 Slalom performance at the Midwest Regional meet. Again Tony had trouble at the 35' off line length, swimming in after getting half of buoy #2 and proving how flighty short line slalom skiing can be.

Prissy Edwards, Alexandria, and Cheryl Schmitt, Mt. Vernon, medaled in Women 6 and Women 5 Overall competition, Prissy finishing 2nd and Cheryl 4th. Edwards was 3rd in Slalom and 2nd in both Trick and Jump to earn some extra hardware, while Schmitt's strongest single event was Jump, where she finished 5th.

Don Bucher, Milford, captured two medals in Men 7 competition, including 4th in Overall and 5th in Jump. Paul Manning, Bringham, rode his Trick ski to a 4th place medal in Men 6.

Scott Tynan, Masters Men Slalom phenom from Columbus, runs in pretty tough company. Scott was one of four skiers who got to enter the slalom course at 41' off the ski rope. His run ended at buoy #1 and included a swim, while the others got a longer ride – though not much longer as 2 buoys at 41' off won the event. Todd Crowe, Morristown, was 11th in the division. Another 34MPH slalom skier, Jeff Cross, New Palestine, performed well at the meet, scoring 2 buoys at 38' off, 19th place, in the very tough and large (37 skiers) Men 3 Slalom field where it took .5 at 41' off to win.

Slalom ski choices – which one to ride? Early season trials on a couple of models left Kim Contos, Pendleton, "enjoying" a Men 5 Slalom season where his favorite ski from one week to the next changed. The turmoil found Kim struggling to recover a full pass that was lost in just one winter's layoff. The 2013 Nationals reflected Kim's season, where his 2 at 38' put him in 14th. The division's winner scored 3.5 at 39.5' off. A year ago Kim would have been in the hunt for top spot.

Next year's Nationals moves to the heat and humidity of the Houston, Texas area. With better Indiana skier participation expected in the Midwest Regional qualifier, set for Water's Edge near Chicago, more Hoosier skiers may be skiing in the 2014 nationals.

The event included the annual general membership meeting that elected the IWSA Board for the 2014 season and updated the membership on all the current activity and future plans of the IWSA.

Larry joined IWSA in 1979 he didn't wait around to get involved and has been a member of the IWSA Board of Directors for 25 years and held the Presidency for 2 years. Larry has taken on the job of writing the IWSA newsletter that we all enjoy in the spring to get our motors running anew for each season and has done so exclusively since it's inception in 1991. Larry holds a Senior Judges rating as well as a regular Scorers rating and has served as Midwest Regional Chief Judge. He has been appointed to judge many Nationals and has even snuck his skiing talents into participating into a few National events as well. Larry was Midwest Regional Tournament Overall Champion in 2001 and 2005. Larry has even held the crash helmet award which is awarded at the state tournament for the most spectacular crash at state. Larry has set numerous state 3 event records, he has been instrumental in establishing the Angola Ski site, and is a past Rollie Williams Award recipient in 1991. Larry helped Fairland set up site for their very first state tournament and has been doing so as he has skied in the state tournament for 35 years. Congratulations Larry.

Most Determined Skier - Neal Clark

After a disappointing performance at the 2012 Nationals held at Okechee Park in West Palm Beach Florida, Neal set his sites on the 2013 Nationals to again be held at the Florida Park. He was so determined and sure of himself that he bought a airline ticket to West Palm in February. Ski season opened and he



started practicing. He entered several June tournaments getting into 32 off and then started watching his ranking with USA Water Ski on line. As July approached, he started getting nervous, Behind his back his ski buddies were worried that he could see his dream of skiing his second consecutive Nationals slowly slipping away. Neal wouldn't be denied so off to Florida to ski a few training sets with none other than Chet Raley. He returned to Hoosier land and improved his score at the Hawthorn Tournament and at the State Championships and got himself qualified. So he thought... As the deadline approached he bounced above and below the cut off line making it nerve racking to even think about. Neal finally made the cut, he went on to regional's and accomplished his goal with a good showing at Nationals.

Nate was also given the Tommy Dorwin Award for his volunteering duties at the Mid west Regional event.

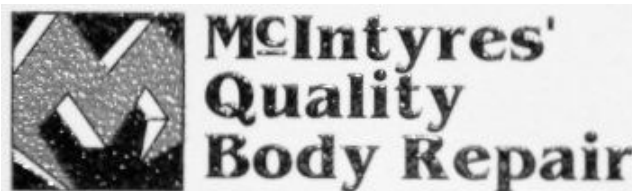

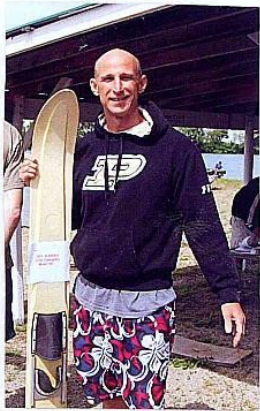

State Ski History - Article from 1951 Local Newspaper

State Ski Meet Here at ¹⁹⁵¹ Wawasee Sunday, Aug. 12 ⁵¹

Plans for the second annual Indiana State Water Ski meet were announced today by Homer Shoop, North Webster, and Chuck Myers, Milford, president of the Indiana State Ski Club.

The meet will be held Sunday afternoon, Aug. 12, on Lake Wawasee, under the auspices of the Indiana State Ski Club, assisted by the North Webster Lions club.

Jumping and trick riding events will be held. Trophies for the winners and runner-up of the meet and each event in both the men's and women's classes will be awarded.

Slalom competition, with medals as prizes, will be offered in both men's and women's classes.

The Mermaid Festival's 1951 "Queen of the Lakes", Miss Betty Bray, of Milford, will reign over the ski meet and will award the trophies to champions in all the events.

All events will be staged on the water front of the South Shore Inn, where the Queen of the lakes will be a complimentary guest.

Jap Jones, owner of the South Shore Inn, has kindly consented to open the spacious three terrace grounds of the hotel to the public for viewing the events.

More than 35 contestants from all across the state will compete. A public address system will be installed for announcing to spectators and contestants the results of each race.

One of the world's finest ski jumps has been made available for the meet by Fay and Marian Ensminger, of Wawasee, who have spent much time and money in recently building a jump to the best Cypress Gardens specifications.

This year, a colorful slalom course will be set up for a separate slalom skiing event. Slalom skiing is on one ski only. The skiers will cut back and forth across the wake attempting to cut around as many evenly spaced buoys as possible. Contestants will receive 10 points for completing the course less two points for each buoy missed.

Some of the tricks that will be performed and their point values are:

180 degree front to back, 40 points.

180 degree back to front, 35 points.

180 degree back to front (lose one ski), 30 points.

360 degree turn on water, 60 points.

One ski jump off ramp, 60 points.

On Water, 1 ski jump, complete wake, 60 ft. line, 60 points.

Hand and feet in skies, rope on toe and recovery, 30 points.

One ski backwards — add 10 points for crossing both wakes, 30 points.

2 skies backwards, 20 points.

1 ski rope on toe, 20 points.

1 ski rope on heel, 20 points.

1 ski rope on neck, 10 points.

2 skies, rope on neck, 5 points.

2 skies, riding one, holding other off water, 5 points.

Rope on toe, free ski overhead in both hands and recovery, 30 points.

Shoe skiing, 30 points.

Dick West of Indianapolis, will serve as chief judge.

The welcoming committee is Dana Gray, Rudy Harrison, Dick Wysong and Norm Kipskius, all of Lake Wawasee.

The calibre of water skiing in Indiana has improved in the past year and a thrilling free show is promised all spectators who desire to attend.

Ski Meet Here ¹⁹⁵¹ Draws 2,000 ^{avg} To View Event

An estimated 2,000 people were at Lake Wawasee Sunday morning, afternoon and evening to witness the second annual Indiana state water-ski meet held in the waters along the southeast shore. Tom Perine, of Indianapolis, scored 900 points to win the men's state championship, while Marian Ensminger, of Indianapolis, captured the women's title. There were 30 contestants in the meet.

Finishing in order behind Perine were Billy Tully, Fort Wayne, Haute, 584; Bob Williams, Attica, 525; Roger Coil, Syracuse, 461; and Chuck Myers, Milford, 387.

In the women's division, Marion Ensminger outpointed Jackie Kendall, of Indianapolis, who was second, and Joyce Harrison, Terre Haute, who was third. Jackie Kendall also received a trophy for winning the women's slalom event. John Popp, of Fort Wayne, won the slalom trophy in the men's division.

1st Meet At Culver

The state water-ski meet was held under the auspices of the Indiana State Ski club, with assistance from the North Webster Lions club. The first annual meet was held last year at Culver on Lake Maxinkuckee.

Homer Shoop, of the North Webster Lions club, was the public address announcer Sunday. Judges were Dave Thompson, of Kalamazoo, Mich., regional vice-president of the American Water-Ski association; Dick West, of Indianapolis, secretary of the Indiana State Ski club; and Charles Walker, of Indianapolis, who judged the first state water-ski meet last year at Culver.

An added attraction during the day came when Ralph Knepp, of Dayton, O., volunteered to put on an exhibition. Knepp is the national free-board champion.

Frank Mills, state auditor, was on hand as guest of Jap Jones.
