You always have your skis with you just in case someone calls.





Timberlake Hosts 2007 Bart's Indiana Water Ski Championships

July 28 and 29, 2007

Mount Vernon, IN - Like the swallows return to Capistrano, Indiana's competition water skiers take to the highways in late July searching for fame and fortune at the Bart's Indiana Water Ski Championships. The 2007 version of that venerable meet was held at the fabulous Timberlake Ski Club, home to an extraordinarily large number of competitors named Schmitt, nestled in the toe of the state near Mount Vernon. More gracious hosts than the members of the Timberlake Ski Club do not exist. Add a first class water ski site to such fine hospitality and it is no wonder skiers flock to Posey County.

The Boys and Girls Slalom divisions took to the water first thing Saturday in a tradition fraught with cool morning temperatures and supported by cranky, creaky, sleepy adults. Kids, wake up! All that talk about how much better the water conditions are at that hour and what an advantage you have is a crock! Unite! Organize and present your grievances to the authorities – mom! Tell mom that unless tournament schedules change in your favor you'll not be doing laundry, cleaning house, mowing the lawn, washing the cars and otherwise doing those chores which make her life cushy. Deliver that ultimatum and... uh ... maybe this isn't such a good idea. There usually is less wind in the morning.

Delaney Jackson rounded 3 buoys at 25K, snagging her Girls 1 first place trophy and some team points for Sawmill Lake. Teammate Nicholas Shedd added his own 6 buoy at 43K first place in Boys 1, just out-pointing Zionville's Caleb Bouwkamp and Blake Miller. Miller, though, brought himself and Champion Lake a first place in Tricks on Sunday, also capturing the Overall gold.

Emma Miner, Brookville, swept both Girls 2 Slalom (4 @ 49K) and Tricks (830) and is a Jump lesson from becoming an Overall contender. She was trailed in Slalom by specialists Brittni Beerman, Waterloo, and Laotto's own Camille Clark, the latter in her first year of G2. Kirby Schmitt kept her grip on Girls 3 Overall by taking first in Slalom (1@22 off), Tricks (1700) and Jump (69') on her home course. Jenna Gilbert represented Ft. Wayne and herself well in G3 Slalom, rounding 3.5 buoys at 55Kfor second place. In a division of single event specialists Boys 3 Slalom held true to expectations as Champion Lake's Nate Smith thrilled the crowd with a winning 3.5@38' off performance. Bryan Beerman, Waterloo, skied 2.5 buoys deep into the maximum 58K speed for a runnerup spot. Jared Sharkey took the red-eye from Mishawaka but seemed none the worse for it, piling up 5260 Trick points to win Boys 3 and set a new state record. The Champion Lake Boys 3 Jump duo of brothers Chase and Matt McCain kept their parents' hearts beating fast. Matt wins the noogie-giving competition at home, but Chase thumped out a 142' leap to take first on the water. Matt's 79 footer wasn't a shabby performance, either.

Pals Briant Detty (Hawthorn) and Sam Jackson (Sawmill) waged a war on the Boys 2 Slalom course and when the shooting was done it was Detty on top by a half buoy over Jackson's fine 1.5@35' off run. While off the winning pace Andrew Schmitt fought and clawed for all he could get in Slalom, 2@28' off, in order to make a charge at Overall. Cousin Clay Schmitt was also hoping to make a push for Overall, and his 4.25@22' off kept him in the hunt, temporarily. Taylor Shedd was .25 buoys behind Clay and Lake Clark (Laotto), suffering an opening set, bobble was in 6th. In Trick it was Andrew Schmitt taking the lead in the Overall competition, winning with a new Indiana State Tournament record 3010 points to Clav Schmitt's 970 and Detty's 680 point runs. Clay Schmitt popped a 79' Jump, opening the door for Detty who lined up and shorted the thirty year old Boys 2 one hundred foot Jump record by just 12 inches. With pressure on Andrew he held serve with a 101' best Jump for a new state Jump record as well as a record setting Overall point total of 2935.2 points, edging Detty by 109 and Clay by 669 points.

In Saturday's Men 1 Trick event Scott Schmitt jumped to a big lead for Overall with a 3920 point throw down on his home water. Bloomington's Aaron Weeks, who got wet in pass #2 sooner than he wanted after a promising first pass total of 1520 points, was second with 1810 points. Tom Pollack, Syracuse, also found trouble in the second pass, but managed a podium finish with 1070 points. Kurtis Threlkeld, Thorntown, and Tim Baker, West Lafayette, finished the Men 1 scoring - a nice way of saying that they don't practice Tricks very much. In Men 2 it was Fishers skier James Bryan who bested Ft. Wayne's Andrew Hipskind Later in the day Weeks soared off the Jump to a 150' first place finish and back in the running for Overall. Threlkeld, more at home on the long boards, went for 143', while Schmitt stayed atop the Overall standings by jumping 121'. Baker was 4th with an 87' best, and Pollack 5th ten feet further back. In Men 2 Hipskind reversed the finishing order from earlier in the day, prevailing over Bryan (51') by virtue of a nice 66' leap.

On Sunday Men 1 Slalom specialists Casey Contos, Noah Vieke, and Matt Beck (Anderson, Indianapolis, and Syracuse, respectively), showed up to do their thing. Casey's 4@ 38 off won the contest with Noah in 2nd, unable to clear his 32' off run (3 buoys). Just one half buoy in back of Noah was Baker, shaking out of his funk to take 3rd. Schmitt was mired in 6th with 2@22 off, behind Threlkeld (6 at 22' off, no continuation) and Beck (4@22' off). Scott's Overall victory was sealed when Weeks tanked on his opening Slalom pass, laying waste to his hope for a run at the Overall title and opening the door for Threlkeld to steal 2nd Overall. Pollack was 7th in Slalom and 5th, trailing Baker, in Overall.

The Men 2 Overall was decided in favor of Bryan as he ran into 35' off (1@35' off). Hipskind found high expectations floating face down in the water on his opening pass. Welcome to the club, Andrew. Our number is legion! While the Men 2 numbers were down, perhaps due to the strain of travel, it is noteworthy that both Hipskind and Bryan chose to court the Siren of Overall.

The NSL and Novice category brought nine skiers from various divisions into the Slalom, Trick, and Jump events with some relaxed rules, but all the enthusiasm associated with the sport. The Driver gang from Fremont went home with a load of trophies in the family truckster. Saige, Tawn and Roth all captured gold in their Girls 2, 3, and Boys 3 divisions. Jennah Ruddick, youngest of the McCordsville Ruddicks, won Girls 1, and Thorntown's Micira Threlkeld took Novice Women with 3 buoys at 31KPH.

In Saturday's Disabled Jump Men 4 veteran Dan Reed, Indianapolis, only landed one scoring jump, going 54' on his Kierstead sit ski for his fourth title and a brand new state record. In later Slalom action Dan caught a case of the opening set dithers and couldn't go beyond 3 ball. On Sunday Dan's Trick points were all tallied in his first pass. His second pass featured that bane of trick skiers a handle extended too far causing an edge to catch and planting his face in the drink. 320 points, though, on pass #1.

Sunday's NSL/Novice Trick event featured some crossover talent from Slalom and a return to action of one of Trick's more colorful competitors. Dave Jarrett, Men 6 Slalom stalwart from Nineveh, stepped into a pair of trick skis and showed himself worthy of a Men 6 win. Nick Melvin, parts unknown but the only Tricker to score in his 2nd pass, won Novice Men, and Indy's Mike Baker won Men 5. Officials were on red alert as Baker skied off the dock, observing closely during his run to see that his catalog of tricks were both suitable for polite company and executed properly. Some spectators were disappointed to not see Baker perform his signature trick - the Lunar Side Slide (unwrapped). Shoreline Anterior View - which he debuted in the 2005 state meet while competing under the moniker "Moondoggie". Rumors were flying that his wife threatened to get medieval on him unless he struck the trick from his list. Smart man.

In Expert Slalom Indy's Mark Qualkinbush found that practice does pay off, taking first place in Men 4 with a 5 buoy at 55KPH effort. Other Men 4 Expert skiers found trouble in their opening pass, with Timberlake's Tom Steinback swimming in from 4 ball, and Steve Gilbert, Ft. Wayne, unable to get to 2 ball. Tom Warneke, Laotto, skied impressively in Men 3 Expert Slalom. His 4 buoys at 28' off sent him home with a first place trophy.

The Women 3 division may have lacked competitors, but while few in numbers the performances were top notch. Specialist Marla Lott, Indianapolis, was smooth up through her 32' off Slalom pass, but her enthusiasm for the 35' off opportunity got her in trouble at #1, giving her a chance to work on her backstroke. Rhonda Schmitt maintained her Trick dominance in this division with a 1300 point first pass, trumped by her more difficult 1620 second pass, for a total 2920 points, the third best Trick score among all women divisions.

Prissy Edwards, Alexandria, and Cheryl Schmitt notched another 1-2 across the board Women 5 finish at this year's meet. Cheryl's 5 buoy Slalom performance at her first crack at maximum speed trailed Prissy's record setting 2.5 buoys at 28' off set. In Jump Prissy scored another state record on her 80' best which Cheryl could not match. When Cheryl went down early on Sunday's Trick pass #2 all hope of a close Overall race evaporated. Still determined to do her best Edwards racked up 3120 points for the Trick win and Overall.

Saturday's Women 4 Slalom saw Philippa Shedd, Columbus, cruise through her 35' off pass, blowing past her old state record of 2.5 at 35' off and getting 1.5 buoys at 38' off on her way to another win. Debbie Ruddick, Michele Threlkeld, and Jean Schmitt gave chase but could not compete at Philippa's level.

Alone in two of three Women 2 events, Carla Stornetta, Indianapolis, captured another Overall trophy. On the way Carla Jumped 81 feet for the best Women's division effort of the meet, and Slalomed around 3.5 buoys at 28' off. Mindy Bates, Angola, sister-in-law Ines Truesdale, Plainfield, and sister Marie Metzler, Brownsburg, joined Carla in the family reunion Trick contest, won by Mindy with 2840 points. Ines had two solid passes for 2050 points and second place, followed by Carla's 1720 and Marie's 1570 effort.

Abby Schmitt took top spot in Women 1 Slalom with half a buoy at 28' off. She was followed by Amy Hamilton and Purdue teammate Michelle Rothfuss, both of whom stumbled on opening passes. Women 1 Jump was contested only by the Purdue duo, Michelle's fine 44' best trailing Abby's 60' jump. On Sunday Molly Harrison arrived from Indianapolis, winning Tricks with 3410 points and seeing that Abby didn't have a perfect record on the way to her Overall victory. Abby's 2630 effort was followed by Amy's expert class run. Rothfuss completed the Trick scoring, finishing in 2nd Overall in the process.

Twenty-one men ages 35 to 66 competed in the 55KPH (34mph for you old-schoolers) Slalom event, the best performances at the 39.5' off line length turned in by the Men 3 pair of Scott Tynan and Chris Clark. Somehow the use of "length" doesn't feel right, so hereafter you'll see a new word, "shordth", as in "10.75 metre line shordth". To an outside observer it may appear that Clark, Laotto, is content to serve as bridesmaid to Tynan, Columbus. This most recent example: Chris - 3 buoys at 39.5' off; Scott - 4.5 buoys at same line shordth. Clark's confidential medical record made available to this reporter by his kids, however, speaks volumes about how Tynan's dominance over him gnaws at Clark and belies his cheery countenance, with huge sums expended on sports psychologists, tarot card readers, and airport Close associates of Clark have masseuses. reportedly urged him to take up Jumping or Trick in order to get over the disappointment of being beaten week, after week, after week, after week.

Men 3 newcomer Brian Dawson, Leo, got his initiation to the tough Men 3 Slalom field. Usually a 2 at 38' off score will yield better than 3rd. Brad Beerman, Waterloo, can prepare Dawson for the inevitable, at least until the Dynamic Duo age into Men 4. Beerman was 4th with 1 at 38' off. Paul

Miller, McCordsville, was thinking about getting a crack at 38' off when his run ended at 35' off's 5 ball. Ron Driver, Fremont, and Danville's Brian Detty also got into 35' off, Rob with 3 and Brian with 1.5 buoys. Tom Jackson, Columbus, and Eric Detty, Mooresville, got 2 and 1.5 at 32' off. Tom Schmitt, having left Posey County to seek his fortune and now residing in Kokomo, is pleased to be back into competition, scoring 5 at 28' off.

Schmitt had some competition, if that is what you'd call it, in Men 3 Trick. Tom won handily with a two pass total of 2080 points. Brian Detty and Paul Miller tied for 2nd, each with 240 points though it should be noted that Detty spread his 240 points over two passes and Miller condensed his into just one. Like a twister dropping out of a dark sky, a battle for Overall had formed, something this Men 3 Division hadn't seen since the heyday of Larry Smith and Randy Sharkey. Miller had a commanding Overall lead coming out of Slalom and the question on everybody's mind was... could he hold his advantage given Detty's prowess in Jump? Three biffs later the crowd had its answer, and safety officials dragged Miller out of the Jump course so Detty could go for 129' and a couple of golds.

Men 4 Slalom aces Kim Contos, Pendleton, and Kevin Smith, McCordsville, waged a tight battle, each getting around #3 ball at 38' off. Only Contos got a look at the outside of number 4, though, and he had his half-buoy win. Feeling the onset of late-forty-itis, Jim Beck, Syracuse, warmed up the crowd - and the heart of his lovely wife, Donna – with a 3.5 at 32' off set. In Men 3 Trick it was Beck's 1210 run getting by Mark Qualkinbush's 760 effort.

Contrary to early reports, "Beat the Bug" shirts displayed by some competitors did not mean that the Timberlake residential neighborhood had been infested with unwanted pests. Announcer Bill Roach, Carmel, was the object of some trash talkin' from fellow Fairland Ski Club members Mike Baker and Dave Jarrett. Roach, facing withering cheap shots from those two, stoically prepared for his Men 5 Slalom run. Alone. Standing dockside, resplendent in his form fitting life jacket and baggy shorts, awaiting the towboat. Into the water he goes, towline draws tight, the accelerating boat's raspy exhaust note like the whistle blast of tugboats pushing the Titanic out to sea. His heart pumps, now, like the steam cylinders of the great ship did then, in manic energy of anticipated greatness....

Roach did surface to thrash both detractors in Trick, it must be said, and he has gone off the Jump ramp, though not in this meet, of which neither man can boast. Indy's Gary Hall got into 35' off, scoring 2.5 buoys to take the Men 5 Slalom title. Mike Baker was disappointed to only card 4 buoys at his first maximum speed pass, though good for runner-up. Don Bucher, Syracuse, warmed up like Baker at slower than maximum speed, but when the fuel/air injectors opened to the max allowed he was left swimming at #1. Ken Meloon, Angola, was beset with trouble on his opening pass and scored but 3.5 buoys. Roach scored.... Not!

The Men 5 Trick scoreboard read like a stigmatism-afflicted set of eyeballs. No, wait, there were brand new state record scores registered by <u>both</u> Paul Manning, Kokomo, <u>and</u> Steve Plummer, Leesburg. A talent contest was proposed, then shelved as officials agreed that a tie was better than whatever might come from the imaginations of those two. Meloon (740) and Roach (280) followed Bucher, who Tricked with friends but Jumped (35') alone. In so doing Don took home the Overall iron.

Dave Jarrett may be capable of more than he showed in Men 6 Slalom. His 4 buoys at 22' off set a new state record, but don't begin to showcase his potential. He had better hurry. Father Time can take away whatever advantages Mr. Goode may promise. Larry Smith, skiing for Angola but hailing from Anderson, had trouble in his opening pass, going down at #2 in what was becoming an all too familiar trend of first pass falls for

experienced skiers. Perhaps the high incidence of first pass Slalom miscues are a result of skiing too late in the day? Monticello's Howard Little snagged another Men 6 Trick title, scoring 1880 points in a close contest which saw Smith squeak by Mishawaka Spray Rider Randy Sharkey, 1670 to 1520. Musculoskeletal disorders being what they are, only Smith answered the bell for Sunday's M6 Jump event, winning both Jump (43') and Overall in the process.

It will be interesting to see who among the current crop of Men 1-3 is still going strong thirty years from now. Les Bender, Ft. Wayne, and Gene Lamberson, Monticello, are happy to limp to the dock, kick into bindings, and have at it in this, their seventh decade. Lamberson tricked a solid 990 points in Men 7 to prove that while you may not be able to teach an old dog new tricks, the old dog still remembers how to do the tricks he learned as a pup. Bender, like so many Slalomr skiers before him, found troubles awaiting him in his first pass, causing him to ski inside #3. No matter, Les got to ski all the way to the east end of the lake, and back again. Who wouldn't rather be skiing than swimming or walking back to the dock?

In an award ceremony at Saturday night's banquet Timberlake's own Terri Branson was announced as the 33rd recipient of the prestigious Rollie Williams Award. Thanks to the members of Timberlake Ski Club for hosting another great Rollie Williams Memorial State Water Ski Championships!

Most Improved Female Skier of the Year

Cheryl Schmitt - Cheryl went all the way in Women's 5 this year, 2nd at state in slalom, tricks, jump and overall, 2nd at Regionals in slalom, tricks, jump and overall, and the best finish ever at Nationals, 10th in slalom, 8th in tricks, 3rd in jump and 4th overall. No this isn't Cheryl's back side, her husband Sam receives the award for the absent Schmitt.

Most Improved Men's 55K Slalom Skier

Chris Clark - Chris has been knocking on the door of his rivals for the last few seasons in the slalom event just waiting for his good fortune to count at a big tournament. Finally at the in the "so talented" event at Nationals in Bakersfield he ran an incredible 5 buoys at 39 off for 3rd place.

Most Improved Skier of the Year

Sam Jackson - Sam has had an incredible season. He went from running his 32 off's and a buoy or two and 35 off at the beginning of the season, to getting deep into 35 off toward the end of the season breaking the regional boys 2 record three different times.

Club of the Year

Hawthorn Lake - Hawthorn Lake always does their share of great events. They host all the Jr. Development events, disabled advanced clinics, Big Rig jump clinics, and they hold their 3 event record tournaments. They did an incredible amount of site work to host one of the most memorable Disabled Nationals to date. And don't forget about the growing attention of the Purdue Alumni Tournament. Whenever there's an event that's looking for a site, Hawthorn seams to step up the need.

NSL Volunteer of the Year

Mark Qualkinbush - Mark was a big host for NSL events in the Fairland and the Indy area. He is always there to drive for the events. If not driving, he provides instruction to skiers and provides boats from MD Boats. He provided the awards and even presented them to the recipients after the events. Not just this year, but Mark has provided his unselfish help to the NSL events for the last 3 years running.

Adaptive Skier of the Year

Lance Black - Lance has always skied his divisional speed which has been at 34 for quite a while. So you can imagine his surprise when he gets to the Disabled Nationals and finds out he has to ski at 36 MPH. He hasn't done that in years. But it didn't stop Lance from representing Indiana well with a win in his slalom event.

Big Rig Jumper of the Year

Briant Detty - B'ster finished 1st in slalom at state with 2 @ 35 off. Then he missed a 30 year old standing jump record of 100 feet by just one foot. (would you replot that please?). Then set a new NOPS record score of 2826. Goes to Regionals and places 3rd in jump. Goes to Nationals and after a disappointing finish in slalom with only 2 at 32 off. He put together a stand up trick run and finally jumped a PB, and a new century club member at 100 feet and finished 3rd in Overall. Just 7 points from the runner up position. B'ster goes into the 2008 season with a #1 National Ranking in Boys 2 jump

Jr. Male Skiers of the Year

Andrew Schmitt - Andy Set 3 new state records jumped 101, tricked 3010 breaking his own record from last year and a new overall record, leaving B'sters current record short lived. He placed in all three events and overall at Regionals, and was 6th in tricks, 5th in jump and 4th overall at Nationals.

Official of the Year

Sam Schmitt - Sam was busy this season at 11 tournaments in 5 different states. Tournament Director for 2 at Timberlake, Indiana State Tournament Official, DuQuoin III. P&C, Disabled Nationals judge, Appointed Judge at Regionals, Assigned judge at Nationals, Judged the Purdue Alumni, Judged the Collegiate Regionals and 2 tournaments in Kentucky.

Slalom Skier of the Year

Nate Smith - Beside winning State and Regionals, Nate went on to tie the Boys 3 Mid West All Tournaments Record of 2 at 39 off, and then the Boys 3 Mid West Tournament record of 2 at 39 off. Nate was the only competitor of 77 skiers in Boys 3 slalom to run 38 off at Nationals and finished with 2 at 39 off for first place. Nate also became an Assistant Judge in slalom and an Assistant Driver in slalom and trick and drove for the Jr. Development clinic...

Female Skier of the Year

Prissy Edwards - 2 new state records in Women's 5, 2 and a half at 28 off in slalom, and an 80 footer in jump. Swept 1st places in Regionals and was 3rd in slalom and trick and 2nd in jump and overall at Nationals. Prissy continues to improve year after year.

Outstanding Achievement

Carl Truesdale and John Kniesley - You will see one of these two at every event in the Indy area, but that's not all they do. Their Sponsorship recruitment allows IWSA to work at the level of success it has for years and for them and the sponsors we are grateful. John has worked second to none with the disabled events for many years. Their promotion and organization skills brought the Disabled Nationals to Indy. They work as instructor's and drivers at Jr. development, and clinics of every kind. They beat the drums of success through out the whole state. They brought the Lake Indy site back to life and started a new club to provide a place to ski for those that need a place to ski. And they made it accessible for disabled skiers as well. These two have provided their help unselfishly for many years and have no signs of letting up.

Skier of the Year

Cale Burdick - Cale was selected to the 17 to 21 US Water Ski Team, competed in the Can Am Challenge wining the slalom event. At Nationals in Open Men's he finished 3rd in slalom and 3rd in jump. He landed a cover on the Water Skier Magazine and was chief instructor at the Jr. Development program. He was 2nd in Slalom at Collegiate Nationals 10th in tricks and 9th in jump and 5th overall. He helped Purdue finish their best ever 4th in the Collegiate Nationals.

Worth Mentioning

Charlie the son-in-law of our Hall of Fame inductee Dick West won the last door prize of the night which was a HO Truth slalom ski provided by PineCrest. We couldn't think of a better winner for the ski which he said he hoped to get his daughter on when she gets a little older.







2007 Regionals Showcase Hoosier Talent

Whirlwind, Kansas: Seven skiers from Indiana won events in the Midwest Regional Water Ski Championships. This group compiled a total of fourteen first place performances over the three day event. Podium award ceremonies included many more Hoosiers as those who made their way deep into the nation's breadbasket came home with lasting memories of a job well done.

Conditions once again varied from day to day, and hour to hour. The number of competitors who missed their opening Slalom pass, fell early in Trick passes, and failed to log a scoring Jump was indicative of high winds which plagued the meet.

Tom Danford blew away the Men 4 Trick field with a 4270 point set of passes on the way to an Overall victory over eight other competitors vying for three-event supremacy. His 5th place 95 foot Jump effort sealed the Overall medal. As expected Prissy Edwards swept all three events plus Overall in Women 5, challenged only by fellow Hoosier Cheryl Schmitt who was runner-up across the board. Cale Burdick also swept the Open Men three-event competition, but his only challenger was.... himself. Nonetheless, Burdick scored 5090 in Trick and though unable to land a scoring Jump, did round #1 at 38' off in Slalom.

New Carlisle Trick specialist Jill Smith got by Mindy Bates, 3650 to 3020, as the two Indiana ladies dominated Women 2 Tricks. Nate Smith's 2 buoys at 38' off in Boys 3 put him atop 21 others in Slalom. Scott Tynan waltzed through the Masters (55KPH) Men Slalom with 2 at 39.5' off for his gold. Two skiers back, in third, was Chris Clark, 2.5 at 38' off.

The Shedd family did their thing in Slalom, with Nicholas taking 4th in Boys 1 Slalom while mom, Philippa, competed only against the course as she took the Open Women Slalom title with 3.5 buoys at 35' off. Nicholas, however, had to beat four other skiers to get his spot on the podium.

Andrew Schmitt was 2nd in Boys 2 Jump (99 feet) and Overall, and by meet's end was calling the podium "home" with a 3rd in Trick (2490 - just 20 points from 2nd) and 4th in Slalom (4 at 28' off). Sam Jackson was 2nd in Boys 2 Slalom, rounding 1.5 at 35 off. Briant Detty was 3rd in Boys 2 Jump (94') with Clay Schmitt just 3 feet back in 4th. In Men 1 Scott Schmitt was runner-up in both Trick (3920 points) and Overall. His Jump and Slalom performance winged his Overall chances, but a 116' Jump did earn a podium spot in 5th.

Sarah Rozow got hot in her Girls 2 Slalom event in time for the Regionals, scoring a sweet 3.5 buoys at 32' off for 2nd - just 3.5 buoys from the winner's best. Molly Harrison scored 3510 points to earn 2nd in Women 1 Trick. In Men 6 a couple of veterans picked up silver medals, Howard Little taking his in Trick and Larry Smith getting his in Overall to go with his 5th place Slalom, and twin 4th place finishes in Trick and Jump. Mike Yoder's 1 buoy at 38' off tied for 2nd and in the run-off he took 3rd in the jam packed Men 3 Slalom field. Men 5 Trick ace Paul Manning got 3rd (1560 points) with fellow Hoosier Ken Meloon taking 5th.

In Men 4 Slalom Kevin Smith found himself tied with Kim Contos, both running 3 at 38' off. In the run-off it was Kevin prevailing and taking home 3rd place while Kim settled for 4th. Kirby Schmitt Tricked 1800 points for 4th in Girls 3, Jumped 65 feet for 5th, and even with her opening set Slalom bobble finished in 5th Overall.

Delaney Jackson wore the family colors to her podium ceremony in Girls 1 Slalom, standing in the 4th spot for the cameraman. The McCain brothers specialize in making mom nervous - they're both Boys 3 Jumpers. Matt M. Was 10th with brother Chase in 4th with a 133 footer.

Other Regional qualifying skiers included Slalom specialists Megan Lambert, Girls 2, and her Men 3 dad, Tony. Camille Clark also slalomed in Girls 2. Tom Jackson had a rough time in Men 4 Slalom as did Nick Rozow in Boys 2. Lake Clark got into maximum speed in Boys 2 Slalom. Tom Pollack Tricked and Jumped in Men 1 where former Hoosier, now Chicagoan, Kurtis Threlkeld finished 5th in Slalom and 4th in Jump. Andrew Hipskind doesn't travel well, finding holes in the lake's surface in Men 2 Trick and Jump, and, like Don Bucher in Men 5, his Slalom experience ended quickly.

NATIONALS 2007

Nate Smith's 2 At 39.5 Off – Wow! Clark Stuns Masters 55KPH Field

Bakersfield, CA – While the water ski world was still recovering from a shock received earlier in the week a jubilant Nate Smith solidified his position in water ski history with an impressive 2 at 39.5 off performance in Boys 3 Slalom. The 16 year old from McCordsville blew away 51 other competitors in his division, posting the 6th best 58KPH Slalom score of the entire 2007 Goode US Nationals. Five of the skiers who scored better were elite Open Men competitors and two of those five only beat Nate by ½ a buoy!

Just four days earlier the 55KPH Masters Men Slalom event, usually an orderly and respectful competition, was stood on its collective ear when Chris Clark posted a Hurculean Slalom score of 5 buoys at 39.5 off, running over, around, and through Scott Tynan who possesses a long history of doing the same to Clark. Tynan, certainly no slouch with his 3 at 39.5 off fifth place skiing, was gracious as he laced up his skates and donned pads for the firstever hockey game held in celebration of Clark's Bronze medal at the brand new River Styx ice rink.

Jill Smith dominated Women 2 Tricks, the 31 year old specialist from New Carlisle's 3640 points over 500 above second place.

Prissy Edwards, Women 5 Jump and Overall Silver medalist, also scored two Bronzes in Slalom, 2.5 at 28' off, and Tricks, 1830 points in spite of falling during her 2nd pass. Prissy's Indiana teammate, Cheryl Schmitt, was 3rd in Jump and 4th Overall. An early fall in her Trick pass #2 cost Cheryl 3rd Overall.

Cagey veteran Tom Danford, Overall Men 4 runnerup, is fairly certain that he'll need to find NOPS points somewhere other than Jump as he's getting pretty old. Tom missed winning Overall by just 45.1 NOPS points - the Overall champ went 145' off the ramp, while Tom's best was 101'. Yikes! Tom's Trick score of 3920 gave him the Bronze medal, and along with Slalom where he went 4.5 at 35' off, represent areas where he could pick up a few more Overall points without risking sheet time. In other news, Scott Tynan could not keep pace with a peaking Chris Clark, conceding to Clark a third place Masters Men Slalom podium spot two steps higher than his own. Schmitt had a great time together in Boys 2, taking 4th and 5th in Jump and 3rd and 4th in Overall. Detty's strong 1.5 at 32 off Slalom vielded too many NOPS points for Andrew's 6th place 2900 Trick score to overcome as the two friends battled through the Overall competition. Beaster's 100 foot Jump crowned a season in which he'd flirted with that distance while Sponge Bob just missed the century mark at 97 feet. Sam Jackson was just 1 buoy off the Boys 2 Slalom podium, scoring 1/2 at 35' off for 7th. Clay Schmitt got all three events under his belt. scoring a nice 83 foot Jump and a 1350 Trick score, but just couldn't gain enough Boys 2 Overall NOPS points to finish higher than 20th. Also in Boys 2, Nick Rozow Slalomed 2.25 at 22' off.

Cale Burdick carded 3rd place Open Men finishes in Slalom and Jump where he went 179 feet off his choice of a five foot six inch ramp. Cale's 3 at 39.5' off Slalom pass was just 1 buoy in back of runner-up Chris Parrish and both well off the meet's best Slalom run of 2.5 buoys at 41' off by Nick Parsons.

Trick specialist Paul Manning medaled again, this time a Bronze recognizing his 2410 point Men 5 Trick effort. Another Trick specialist, Molly Harrison, grabbed 8th in Women 1 with 2500 points. In Masters 55KPH Slalom Chris Clark beat Scott Tynan by 2 buoys.

Sarah Rozow showed real promise in Girls 2 Slalom with her 1.5 at 32' off good for 15th. In Boys 3 Chase McClain gave his Jump skis a nice ride, going 140' for 10th. Jared Sharkey's Boys 3 Trick set started with an unscheduled swim in pass #1. A 1900 point 2nd pass was a better representation of his skill.

Girls 2 Megan Lambert placed better than her Men 3 dad, so while both slalom experts enjoyed dinner.... the check went to Tony. Both into 38' off, Kevin Smith rounded 3 buoys while Kim Contos went down after 1.5 in M4 Slalom, finishing 14th and 28th, respectively, in a field of skiers 77 strong. This just in: Clark, 107 buoys, Tynan, 105.


2007 Rollie Williams Award Recipient Terri Branson




